Words From The Summits Captain of Eagles, Tryggr

My intention with this message is to address the lack of archery officers within the Principality. As the archery deputy in the Summits, I ask that you take a step towards promoting archery at your local group. We need branch archery officers! As your archery champion, I am well within my right to call you out and inspire you to step up and make that contribution to our archers. What say you Summits?

The An Tir Book of Target states that:

B.2 Junior Marshals

a. Juniors may not take on the final responsibility for safely setting up and running the range unless they are a Branch Officer running a local event or practice.

B.4 Branch Marshals

- a. Branch Marshals are officers of a specific branch. They must maintain a current junior or senior TM authorization card and SCA membership for the term of their office.
- b. Branch Marshals are responsible for setting up and running the local practices and events. They may appoint another marshal to run the range but are responsible for submitting scores and other reports.
- c. Branch Marshals should file monthly activity reports to their Seneschal. They are required to give quarterly reports to the reporting deputy of their region.

C.1 General Safety Rules

a. Each event holding Archery and/or Thrown weapons activities must have a designated Target Marshal in Charge (MIC) who is responsible for all target activities. This MIC may be the Branch Target Marshal of the chapter sponsoring the event, or a senior TM who is acceptable to the Event Steward, and the Kingdom Royal Archer or Earl Marshal.

This is a volunteer organization and its greatest achievement is that it continues from year to year to be an exceptional form of active fun. We honor and all that is best in life while promoting the chivalric arts. The credit for all of this goes to those who play and to those who allow us to do it safely. Only by your efforts may we thrive.

All Fools

All Fool's

Join Central Oregon's Shire of Corvaria as we Come together and celebrate All Fool's on the 5th of April 2014.

All Fool's has been celebrated since the second century. Because the weather had most likely turned fair by this time, martial sporting events were often held. Among the most popular were archery and quarterstaff contests (quarterstaff's were eight-foot poles that combatants used to "break the heads" of their opponents). Other traditional observances for the feast included the fools parade, where revelers disguised themselves with costumes and masks and paraded through the town or village, demanding entrance into homes. Not even the homes of the great and powerful could be shut to the fools parade, and once inside, they would demand food and drink. This is not unlike the Halloween custom of trick or treating. All Fool's also traditionally marked the beginning of the spring planting season. (Diehl & Donnelly; *Medieval Celebrations*, Stackpole books 2001. p 9)

Hocktide Emprise

Saddle your warhorse, polish your armor, string your bow, grab your lance, broadsword or rapier, and make the journey to the Hocktide Emprise! We celebrate the return of Sol with 3 days of martial activities on foot and horseback, including a Summits War Muster and general merriment. See our website for comprehensive information about the event and all Tourney details: www.hocktide.com.

On Saturday, we proudly present the Hocktide Mounted Equestrian Champion Noblesse Oblige Tourney, consisting of three parts: Pageantry, Travel, and Combat (including Javelin and Spear). Riders are encouraged to participate in all or in part, and the only entry requirements are both authorizations and a prize contribution appropriate to your rank.

Also on Saturday are the Glyn Dwfn Defender heavy tournament, a Rapier tournament (both also Noblesse Oblige) and Archery games. In the evening, there will be Court and a bonfire gathering. On Sunday, there will be a Summits Muster war practice and alternative martial equestrian activities before we say farewell.

There are Period and non-Period camping areas on site, as well as potable water. Camping next to horse stalls is available and is a mandatory quiet area. Fires are encouraged in above-ground fire pits, and some ground fires will be allowed in the war area only (less noise restrictions), if current fire restrictions allow it. The site is discreetly wet in period containers only, but safe behavior is our highest priority when camping around horses.

The site opens to everyone 10am Friday and closes at 6pm Sunday. Merchants and those bringing horses may arrive 3pm Thursday and/or depart Monday morning by prior arrangement. Merchants are welcome with no fee, but a donation is requested; contact the Event Steward to reserve a spot.

Horse Pre-Notification must be received by 4/30. Pre-notification is encouraged for all, but it is mandatory for all equestrians and merchants and highly recommended for those wishing to reserve a camping space in the Period camping area. Go to the website for the General Form or the Equestrian Form. For those bringing horses, accommodations for their mounts are in 12'X12' uncovered panel stalls costing \$10 a night per horse (checks payable to Farwood Horse Park will be collected at Gate).

Costs are \$15 for Adults, \$10 for youth, 12/under no charge, \$30 family cap (Immediate family only, excluding horses and Non Member Surcharge). Standard non-member surcharge of \$5 will apply to all adults. Make checks payable to the Shire of Glyn Dwfn, SCA, Inc.
