

SO YOU WANT TO HAVE HORSES AT YOUR EVENT?

Really? Are you sure? Okay here are some things you need to know in order to make it possible to have horses and horse activities at your event.

First let's talk about the logistical issues. What do you NEED in order to make this happen?

Suitable Location Requirements:

- Horse Space – Horses are large animals and need a fair bit of room. The site must have room to house the number of horses expected and there must be enough room to hold the activities planned. If you do not intend to make the entire site a "Horse Area" then start thinking about where you do and do not want horses. Fully integrated horse events have everyone signing the EQ waiver at the front gate which makes things easier for the EMiC. Note: This does not mean horses then automatically have free run of the event. The Event Stewart can still designate areas off limits to horses. Camps and crowded social areas are normally assumed to be such off limit areas.
- Truck & Trailer Parking – Room for trucks with trailers to not only park, but also turn around without sinking into some soft spot. Most equestrians like to camp near their horses so trucks and trailers have to be taken in to account in the horse camping calculations. Also, horse trailers are almost universally hard on the ambiance and are difficult to move. So give some thought to how their presence will affect the look of your event.
- Water – Horse drink a lot of water. The site must have water available very near the horse camping area.
- Footing – The area where the horse activities are to take place must have, at the time of the event, relatively level, comparatively dry, reasonably smooth footing. The more energetic the activity, the better the footing needs to be. Obviously a mounted procession or town cry, requires less ideal footing than say a challenge course.
- Manure Disposal – Yes, there needs to be a place to dump when the horse owners clean up after their animals. Figure on roughly 20-25lbs of manure and bedding per horse, per day. Often there are people who are willing to haul this all way to use as fertilizer.

The very best choice of locations is an existing horse facility. If one looks around a bit in their area it is usually possible to find a nice stable, boarding facility or fairground to hold your event. This choice not only benefits the horse community, but very often these locations are even great for events without horses. They often have good parking, room for camping, covered areas in case of bad weather and sometimes even rooms for classes. I recommend the autocrat of any event to consider horse facilities as a site even if horses are not currently being considered.

Insurance Issues:

- EQ Insurance is required by the SCA for any event where horses are to present. The cost of the insurance is \$50 per named party. So if the site has a pair of owners for instance, and both wish to be named separately then the cost would be \$100. In one recent case the event covered two adjacent properties, so again, \$100.
- Said insurance has to be **ordered and processed** at least 45 days prior to the event. So get that request in very early.
- Information such as exact dates and times, site owner's name, address and phone number, event coordinators name, address, phone number and email address are required at the time the insurance is ordered.
- A copy needs to be requested to sent to the EMiC

You can call the Milpitas office with your credit card number. This way, if you missed any information it can be fixed quickly.

When the insurance paper is received, send a copy to the EMIC, who will forward a copy to the KEO and keep a copy for the event. **This insurance paper must be received before your event.** [More ->](#)

Staffing Requirements:

- EMiC is the Equestrian Marshal in Charge. King Law requires that this be a Senior EQ Marshal. Currently we have only 3 such marshals in the Summits, but should none of them be available, a request can be sent to Kingdom EQ Marshal to see if someone from further north can come and help out.
- The Horse/Equestrian Stewart is the person who serves as the liaison between the horse folk at the Event Stewart. They are present to direct the arriving equestrians as to where to camp and park, arrange for ground crew and with the EMiC, determine the equestrian activities to be held, when and where. The EMiC and EQ Stewart can be the same person.
- Ground crew are individuals who are authorized to assist with running of equestrian activities by resetting elements, handing up weapons, holding horses, etc.

Finding people to fill these roles is a must. Without them, especially the EMiC, horse at an event are just not possible. Find a good EMiC and they will likely take care of most of the work required.

Know What You Want

While I am the first to say that having horses at an event alters the feel of the thing in a very real, and I feel, positive way. That being said, it is not enough to just “want horses at the event”. Some thought must be given to what part you want horses to play in the scheduled activities.

Do you want just a class on horses and the etiquette of interacting with them? Do you want horses as part of a court ceremony or to be used by the Heralds for mounted town cry? Do you want riders to be able to ride on nearby trails? Do you want there to be competition in the form of a challenge course? Do you want all of the above and to integrate the horses and riders right into the basic nature of the event as has been done at Hocktide?

Having realistic desires as to how you want the equestrian community involved is very important.

In Conclusion

As Summits Captain of Horse, it has been immensely gratifying to see the Summits go from ZERO horse friendly events when I was offered the job to the possibility of as many as SIX in the next event season.


I will continue to do everything within my power to help the different areas of our Principality expand their horse involvement as much as they wish to.

This Month in Medieval History: September

530: Two Popes Consecrated. Both Boniface II and Dioscorus were consecrated as pope. The schism that resulted would end with Dioscorus' death.

622: Muhammad completes the *hijrah*. After suffering persecution in Mecca for promulgating the new religion of Islam, Muhammad escaped to Medina in a journey known as the *hijrah* (also spelled *hijra* or "Hegira" in Latin), or emigration.

973: Abu Rayhan al-Biruni. Al-Biruni wrote treatises on time-keeping and the astrolabe, and made significant advances in mathematical studies.

1189: Richard the Lionheart crowned king of England

1339: Edward Declares War. The Hundred Years' War officially began when King Edward III of England declared war on France.

1422: Henry VI Becomes King of England. Upon the death of his father, Henry V, 9-month-old Henry VI became king of England. He was not, however, officially crowned until he was eight.

1397: Francesco Landini Dies. Landini was a leading composer of 14th-century Italy.

1542: Cabrillo Discovers California. Portuguese-born navigator and explorer Juan Cabrillo was the first European to encounter any part of California when he sailed into San Diego bay.

Recipe: Cherry Pottage

*This recipe is an excerpt from *A Forme of Cury* (circa 1390) which was included in the 16th c. compilation, *Curye on Inglysch*. Included is a redaction for the modern cook.*

Cherry Pottage

Tak cheryes & do out the stones & grynde hem wel & draw hem thorw a streynour & do it in a pot. & do therto whit gres or swete botere & myed wastel bred, & cast therto good wyn & sugre, & salte it & stere it wel togedere, & dresse it in disches; and set theryn clowe gilofre, & strewe sugre aboue.

A Modern Redaction:

2 lbs ripe red cherries, pitted
1 1/2 cups white wine
3/4 cup sugar
4 Tbsp butter
1 cup breadcrumbs
pinch of salt



Wash the cherries and remove the stems and stones. Puree the fruit in a blender with 1/2 cup of the wine and half the sugar. Add a little more wine as needed to get a smooth puree. Melt the butter in a saucepan and add the fruit puree, breadcrumbs, remaining wine, remaining sugar, and salt. Simmer, stirring often, until the puree is very thick. Pour into a serving bowl, cover, and let cool. The cherry pottage should be the consistency of a thick apple sauce. Refrigerate until served. Garnish with a sprinkle of sugar, if desired.

Game: Riddles

Throughout the Middle Ages, riddles were used not only to keep the minds of children busy but to sharpen the mind of even hardened warriors. Here are five actual Saxon riddles from the Viking era, translated for your enjoyment.

Riddles of this kind were often created with two possible answers: one more raunchy in nature (the more obvious answer) and one more subdued. The answers provided reflect only the later.

1. On earth there's a warrior of curious origin.
He's created, gleaming, by two dumb creatures
for the benefit of men. Foe bears him against foe
to inflict harm. Women often fetter him,
strong as he is. If maidens and men
care for him with due consideration
and feed him frequently, he'll faithfully obey them
and serve them well. Men succour him for the warmth
he offers in return; but this warrior will savage
anyone who permits him to become too proud.
2. The dank earth, wondrously cold,
first delivered me from her womb.
I know in my mind I wasn't made
from wool, skillfully fashioned with skeins.
Neither warp nor weft wind about me,
no thread thrums for me in the thrashing loom,
nor does a shuttle rattle for me,
nor does the weaver's rod bang and beat me.
Silkworms didn't spin with their strange craft for me,
those strange creatures that embroider cloth of gold.
Yet men will affirm all over this earth
that I am an excellent garment.
O wise man, weigh your words
well, and say what this object is.
3. A woman, young and lovely, often locked me
in a chest; she took me out at times,
lifted me with fair hands and gave me
to her loyal lord, fulfilling his desire.
Then he stuck his head well inside me,
pushed it upwards into the smallest part.
It was my fate, adorned as I was, to be filled
with something rough if that person who possessed me
was virile enough. Now guess what I mean.
4. A strange thing hangs by man's hip,
hidden by a garment. It has a hole
in its head. It is stiff and strong
and its firm bearing reaps a reward.
When the retainer hitches his clothing
high above his knee, he wants the head
of that hanging thing to find the old hole
that it, outstretched, has often filled before.
5. I saw a creature: his stomach stuck out behind him,
enormously swollen. A stalwart servant
waited upon him. What filled his stomach
had travelled from afar, and flew through his eye.
He does not always die in giving life
to others, but new strength revives
in the pit of his stomach: he breathes again.
He fathers a son; he's his own father also.



Last Event's Directions :

From Adiantum/North - take your best route to I-5, take I-5 South to exit 119 (SR-42)

From Roseburg/South - take your best route to I-5, take I-5 North to exit 119 (SR-42)

The Following Directions are the same from either the North or South direction:

Take SR-42 to Coquille, Oregon. Turn Right on East 2nd Street (One block past Coquille's only traffic light). There will be signs for the SCA and LaVerne Park. Go Straight, pass the 4 way stop and pass the 4 way flashing stop and continue forward through the traffic light (ok so coquille has more than one light but only one on SR-42). Take the first right hand turn past the traffic signal. This will be Coquille Fairview Road. Follow this road for 14 miles to LaVerne Park. The roads will be well marked with SCA signs.

Please note that Coquille is the last reasonably priced gas/grocery stop. There is a convenience store with gas and groceries 5 miles before you reach the site. Also be aware that most mapping programs are wildly inaccurate for this area.

Come help us to honor Myrtleholt's patron saint, St. Eggbert.

The Story of St. Eggbert of the chickens:

Eggbert was born, the third son of a fowler at Hennford, England in the year 402 AD. The local priest taught him letters when he was seven. He became a wandering monk preaching to any listener. He used a hens egg to explain the Trinity and while happily dining on roasted fowl said: "if thy right wing offend thee then then pluck it off." Eggbert was a pious but odd man often sleeping in hen houses. One night, fierce vikings raided the small hold. Eggbert, half asleep in the coop was beaten to death by a huge Dane wielding a pair of pilfered cocks.

The Shire of Myrtleholt celebrates St. Eggbert's Feast is because many years ago the Shire was given a mystical sign. There had been a feast wherein all meats were poultry. After this feast shire members exhibited red itchy rashes, fevers and swelling of the bodies - all indicative of the Pox of Henne. Superstitious mutterings causes one Lady to even change her name from "de Poulet" to "de Faucon". The plague caused people to look to heaven for help. A story was circulated about the man called Eggbert who seemed a Saint. A large statue of a rooster was located in a nearby village. Plague victims and survivors made pilgrimage there to beseech Eggbert to end the plague. They honored him with a feast in the Fall. The Plague of Henne was gone.

SAINT EGGBERT'S FEAST:

On this day we will celebrate not only with a feast but also with classes, competitions, games, and of course our "Gatekeeper Tourney" (see below). Our classes will include period leather shoe making, drop spindle spinning, while our competition will include codpiece decorating and the "Game of Goose.". We will have games for small and "big" kids and anyone with a serious desire to have fun. The feast will of course honor poultry with "Chicken on a bed of figs" and the ever popular "Chicken pies". We will have freshly baked breads, salads, fruits and cheeses, and finally deserts for every palate. There will be dishes for vegetarians, vegans, and of course meat lovers. So come join those of us from Myrtleholt and celebrate the beauty of Autumn.

GATEKEEPER TOURNAMENT:

We will be seeking a champion in the Gatekeeper Tournament. The Gatekeeper has been and always will be the Defender of Cavern's Gate's Ruby-eyed Albino Aligator. For years, many have sought to slay this rather innocent beast for it's treasured eyes and highly prized hide. In order to ensure that the champion of this tournament is fully capable of handling the responsibility he/she will be entrusted with, this year's tournament will involve a thorough lifelike test of skill. This tournament will be in 2 parts:

Part A: A traditional tourney of fighting that will select the top combattants for entry into Part B. The details of weapons and style of combat will be revealed on the day. Bring all your arms and defenses as any might be called into action.

Part B: Protector/Attacker: The top fighters from Part A will be paired off. In each bout one fighter will serve as protector, the other attacker. The protector will be charged with the task of protecting the Ruby-eyed Albino alligator as it attempts to capture the towns people's chickens. The towns people will of course be charged with trying to keep their chickens away from the albino aligator. The albino aligator will be allowed to move only around a perimeter pathway just outside the lists attempting to capture a chicken from the wiley towns people. The towns people will only be allowed to stand outside the aligator path. The protector must protect not only himself, but also keep the attacker from managing to get close, and thus capture the aligator. The attacker may win by either capturing the aligator or by defeating the protector. The protector may win by either defeating the attacker or by guarding the chicken-bearing aligator safely back to it's lair, the cavern. Each of the six will be given a chance to be protector and attacker. Additional rounds will be fought until a champion, and thus a new Defender is found.
